

Degree Colours

The standard colours for hoods and facings for the degrees in the separate faculties shall correspond as nearly as possible with colours and numbers of the British Colour Council Dictionary of Colour Standards and the Australian Colour Standard AS2700S — shown in brackets below. Hoods and facings shall be constructed of corded silk.

Description of Academic Dress

Academic dress shall be worn at special University ceremonies as Senate may from time to time determine.

HOLDER OF MORE THAN ONE DEGREE

There is no provision for a combination of colours for the holder of more than one degree. The usual practice is to wear the degree colour appropriate to the occasion (e.g. at a graduation ceremony, the colour of the degree being awarded).

Optional Colours

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students are given the option of wearing stoles representing their respective community flags, over the academic gowns but underneath the hoods, at University graduation ceremonies.
